Dear Friends,

What a fantastic year it has been for The Arc of San Antonio! Your generous support empowered us to serve more than 2,300 families this year. Together, we have faced challenges head-on, replacing 11 HVAC units between our two facilities and putting on a brand-new roof on the Pam Stephens Center location. Our momentum also helped propel us to a record-breaking Roses and Races Gala – netting more than \$395,000.

The Adult Life Enrichment (ALE) program remains a cornerstone of our services, supporting 200 adults with IDD annually. Over 2,100 families benefited from our free care coordination, case management, and referral services.

We still face the pressing challenge of a widening gap, \$1 million this year, between revenues and ALE program expenses. The current Medicaid reimbursement rate of \$10.60/hour is untenable. In the upcoming 2025 legislative session, The Arc will join forces with partners from across the state to advocate for an increase in reimbursement rates to continue to provide quality services with dedicated and caring staff. We hope you will join us!

I am profoundly grateful to each of you—our donors, our amazing staff, and our dedicated board—for standing by us. It is my privilege and honor to walk alongside you in fulfilling our mission of improving the lives of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and those who care for them.

Adult Life Enrichment (ALE)

The Adult Life Enrichment program inspires adults (18 years and older) with IDD to discover and develop their unique talents and passions through engaging, hands-on learning experiences. With a thoughtful mix of onsite and communitybased activities, participants are empowered to confidently pursue personal goals and aspirations. These enriching opportunities foster stronger relationships, meaningful volunteer contributions, and greater independence, paving the way for a vibrant and fulfilling future.

Community Services Case Management (CSCM)

CSCM supports families who care for children and young adults with special health care needs and disabling conditions that Medicaid does not currently cover.

The Arc helps caregivers navigate the overwhelming network of service providers. Case Managers work with families to identify needs, create personalized care plans, and help connect with resources in areas such as financial planning, Medicaid Waivers, transition to adulthood, health care, education, community support, and guidance for the future. Most families served by CSCM qualify as low income. 265 individuals 3 to 21 years old served.
76% with autism as primary diagnosis.
24% with other diagnoses such as cerebral palsy, Down syndrome, and genetic/chromosomal conditions.

Family Support Services (FSS)

The Arc helps families access community-based resources through all stages of life. The FSS program provides a social service "home" for caregivers of children and adults with intellectual and other developmental disabilities.

FSS staff connect families to community resources like funding programs, medical providers, respite care, support groups, case management services, and advocacy.

FSS is funded entirely through donations, enabling us to serve families without regard to age, diagnosis, or income.

771 unduplicated families received care coordination support.

593 additional families assisted with resources and referrals.

Partnerships with **13 school districts** and some charter and private schools.

Supporting a Family: Giving Hope

The Arc recently helped a family navigate transition with the death of a primary caregiver. This family was grappling with profound loss and newfound responsibilities. A student lost her mother in April and just turned 18, leaving her grandmother to step in as her primary caregiver. Despite her unwavering love and dedication, the grandmother faced immense challenges without legal guardianship documentation. She had been trying to secure guardianship through a legal firm for months.

Understanding the urgency of the situation, FSS coordinator Lillian immediately assured the grandmother that she would find the necessary resources and support. True to her word, a few days later, Lillian connected with representatives from the Bexar County Probate Court. She shared the family's plight, and they provided critical information to help move the guardianship process forward. Today, we are happy to report that the grandmother completed the required evaluation, and in October 2024, guardianship was granted.



Community Living Assistance and Support Services (CLASS)

CLASS, a Medicaid Waiver program, provides home and community-based services as an alternative to an intermediate care facility for individuals with an intellectual disability or related conditions.



The Arc provides comprehensive case management and assists participants in accessing the resources they need to live and work as independently as possible. Case Managers coordinate attendant care, specialized therapies, adaptive aids, minor home modifications, family respite care, and more. Long-term supports and services (LTSS) are based on the child's or adult's unique needs identified in an individual plan of care developed by the participant and their service planning team.













